

## **2009 U.S. YOUTH GOE CHAMPIONSHIP (USYGC)**

The AGA is pleased to announce the opening of the 2009 USYGC national competition season. Our goal for this year is to attract more players from among American youth to compete, renew friendships, and select the United States representatives for the 2009 World Youth Go Championships (WYGC). The USYGC is an ING Foundation and AGA-sponsored national competition exclusively for our youth players. It is organized into eight qualifier events across the country leading to the national championship Finals. The Finals winners in each age division will represent the AGA at the next WYGC.

### **Participation Guidelines**

USYGC events are open to all US residents meeting the age requirements set by the WYGC. Finalists must meet additional eligibility requirements in order to compete in the championship tournament.

### **WYGC Age Requirements**

Players must meet the age criteria by the calendar set by the WYGC organizers. There are two age groups: under 12 (junior) and 12 through 17 inclusive (senior). The cutoff date for each group is the day that the World Youth Go Championship begins. The tentative date for the 2009 WYGC is August 1, 2009. To be eligible to compete in the senior division of the 2009 USYGC, a player must be 17 or younger on that date. To be eligible for the junior division in 2009, a player must be 11 or younger on the day the WYGC begins.

### **Eligibility Requirements for USYGC Finalists**

1. US citizens by April 30, 2009, and
2. AGA membership (full, youth, sustaining, sponsor or life) at the beginning of a player's first qualifier tournament, which must be maintained throughout the entire period of the USYGC tournament and WYGC event, and
3. physical residence in the United States, its territories or possessions, for at least six of the twelve calendar months prior to May 24, 2009. For AGA members with families assigned to U.S. military duty overseas, time overseas will be counted as residence in the United States. Qualifier winners in each age group will be required to provide written proof of residency.

First place winners in any qualifier event for four consecutive years, including cross-over years from junior to senior divisions, must skip one year before resuming competition in the USYGC.

### **Event Guidelines**

#### **Qualifier Events**

1. All qualifier events must be scheduled between January 15 and April 13. Actual dates are at the discretion of the hosting chapters but need to be coordinated with the USYGC Coordinator.
2. There will be eight (8) qualifier events with a separate competition for each age division. There is no limit to the number of participants in each qualifier event or division.
3. The location of qualifier events may change from year to year.
4. The qualifier event involves play over two consecutive days and may be stand-alone or in addition to an AGA event being held by the Chapter.
5. All qualifier events will use ING rules.

6. All games in the competition for the qualifier winner must be played without handicaps, and should be AGA-rated. Komi is 8 points. Handicaps are allowed consolation rounds or in other games that will have no bearing on the winner.
7. The tournament format may vary between qualifiers depending on the number of players and their ratings in each age division. Formats may include Round Robin, Swiss McMahon, elimination rounds and a final round, or any other established and accepted format over both days. To the fullest extent possible, tournament formats should allow players to play as many different players as possible within their age groups.
8. Rules of Play:
  - a) Time – 60 minutes main time per player; overtime 5 periods of 30 seconds.
  - b) Clocks – required; clock type at the discretion of event organizer.
  - c) Tournament results must produce clear 1st and 2nd place winners.
  - d) In the event of a tie, Ing tie-breaking rules will be used (in order: SODOS, SOS, SOSODOS, SOSOS).
  - e) In the event of disputes, the decision of Tournament Director at the event is final.
9. For no-shows by the time the first round begins, the Tournament Director will adjust the pairings as appropriate.
10. Players pay their travel and accommodation to the qualifier events.
11. Players may participate in up to two different qualifiers per year, but only if they do not win the first qualifier in which they play.
12. Youth players who are ineligible for the finals may compete in the event, but must be paired in such a way that they do not risk knocking out eligible players. This may be done by having them compete in a separate bracket, or only having them compete with players that have already been knocked out.

#### Final Event

1. The U.S. Youth Go Championship is scheduled to be held each year by June 1 (typically on Memorial Day weekend) and will be hosted by an AGA chapter.
2. The Final Event may be held as a stand-alone event or held in conjunction with an additional AGA event being run by the Chapter.
3. The final event is defined as follows:
  - a) Format – 6 round Swiss over two days.
  - b) Time – 60 minutes main time per player; overtime 5 periods of 30 seconds.
  - c) There is a maximum of 8 players in each age division.
  - d) For no shows by the time the first round begins, the Tournament Director will adjust the pairings as appropriate.
  - e) Clocks – required; clock type at the discretion of event organizer.
  - f) Ties will be broken using the Ing rules (in order: SODOS, SOS, SOSODOS, SOSOS).
4. In the event less than 16 finalists confirm their attend at the finals, the following rules are to be used to fill any vacancies:
  - a. In the event that the 1st place winner in a Qualifier is unable to attend the Finals, the 2nd place runner-up will be invited to attend.
  - b. If both 1st and 2nd place finishers from a qualifier are unable to attend or if fewer than eight qualifiers take place, then the USYGC Coordinator is authorized to make a discretionary selection from among all other participants in the national collection of Qualifiers using AGA ratings and over-all playing record in the

qualifiers. The USYGC Coordinator will consult with the hosting chapters in making such a selection.

### **AGA Support**

USYGC Coordinator – Daniel Short ([usygc@usgo.org](mailto:usygc@usgo.org)) will manage the program and is the AGA's first point of contact for anyone with questions or interest on the program.

Qualifier Tournament Directors – These volunteers will be approved by the AGA and announced with the hosting chapters to run the qualifier events. The AGA will call for volunteers annually, interested chapters should register their willingness to host a qualifier or the final event. The AGA will make the final decision on the venues based on a variety of factors including but not limited to the alternatives available, proximity to already approved qualifier venues, prior experience in hosting major tournaments, resources available locally to manage the tournament, etc.

The AGA will provide certificates for all players who compete in the qualifiers.

***Players cover their own costs to the qualifier events. The AGA covers travel and accommodation costs for the final event. Meals are not included at any event unless the host chapters provide them. Parents and chaperons pay their way to all events.***

### **ING Foundation Support**

The USYGC is generously funded by the ING Chang-ki Wei-Ch'i Education Foundation through an annual grant program. These funds support all the qualifiers and the finals event that generates the AGA's youth representatives to play in the prestigious World Youth Go Championship. The international venue of that event changes each year and more information will be announced as soon as it is available.

### **Prizes**

#### Qualifiers

1. The winners of each qualifier event receive economy airfare to the city of the USYGC Finals. Hotel accommodations for the player and one parent/guardian will also be provided for two nights. Parents must pay their own airfare to the finals. Additional prizes for the Qualifiers are at the discretion of the hosting chapters.
2. In addition to competing for the right to play in the World Youth Go Championship, all first place winners at each qualifier event are entitled to receive a partial scholarship for one of the AGA's summer US Go Camps. The scholarship is in the amount of \$400 and is provided by the American Go Foundation (AGF). The scholarship can be applied to any AGA-supported Go Camp in the calendar year it is won. The scholarship funds will be provided directly to the Camp Directors to defray the costs of the youth attending. If the winners are unable to use the scholarship, it may be awarded to any other youth who completed a qualifier event, at the discretion of the AGF Youth Coordinator and in conjunction with the tournament directors. Scholarship funds are not transferable to another year or another player by any winners.

#### Finals

1. All players in the USYGC Finals receive certificates for participating.
2. The winner of the USYGC Final in each age division will receive a trophy and a trip to the World Youth Go Championship later that year with travel expenses

paid by the sponsor. The AGA will assist in coordinating logistics with the sponsor after the final event.

### **Additional Information for Tournament Directors**

1. Each Qualifier Tournament Director (TD) is to submit a tournament plan to the USYGC Coordinator prior to the start of their Qualifier. The plan needs to include date, venue and format information such as the schedule of the games, number of participants anticipated for formatting purposes and the anticipated tournament format. Prizes and refreshments information is optional but recommended.
2. Pre-registration for qualifier events is very strongly recommended. This allows Qualifier TDs to make formatting choices earlier and confirm pairings in advance. Late entries and last minute arrivals may be excluded from the event or deferred to the second round at the discretion of the Tournament Directors if including such players delays the start of the event or requires a material change in the tournament format. The decisions of the Qualifier TD are final.
3. Qualifier event fees are at the discretion of the hosting AGA chapter. There are no fees for playing in the finals. Any fees collected should be used to cover venue and equipment expenses, refreshments, local prizes, transportation, etc.

Individual qualifier TDs decide the event format. Tournaments must produce a clear 1<sup>st</sup> place winner and 2<sup>nd</sup> place runner-up. This means that if the format cannot produce clear 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> finishers in a given number of rounds, the TD must be prepared to play an additional round or use Ing tie breaking rules (in order: SODOS, SOS, SOSODOS, SOSOS).

4. Tournament results are to be submitted to the USYGC Coordinator no later than 48 hours after the Qualifier. These will be published in the E-Journal and on the AGA's website for the public to watch the progress of the players. The report to the Coordinator must also include photographs from the event. Photographs of both youth players and games being finished using the Ing counting method are particularly desirable.
5. Ratings reporting: Qualifier results should be submitted to the AGA Ratings Coordinator ([ratings@usgo.org](mailto:ratings@usgo.org)) no later than 48 hours after the Qualifier. Required data includes players' names, AGA ID numbers, pairings, results, colour designations and any information on tie-breakers.
